What information we collect, use, and why

We collect or use the following information to **provide and improve products and services for clients**:

- Names and contact details
- Occupation
- Payment details (including card or bank information for transfers and direct debits)

- Records of meetings
- Website user information

We collect or use the following personal information for **information updates or marketing purposes**:

- Names and contact details
- Marketing preferences
- Purchase or account history

We collect or use the following personal information for **research or archiving purposes**:

- Names and contact details
- Purchase or client account history
- IP addresses

We collect or use the following personal information to **comply with legal requirements**:

- Name
- Contact information
- Any other personal information required to comply with legal obligations

We collect or use the following personal information for **dealing with queries**, **complaints or claims**:

- Names and contact details
- Payment details
- Purchase or service history

Lawful bases and data protection rights

Under UK data protection law, we must have a "lawful basis" for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible lawful bases in the UK GDPR. You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO's website.

Which lawful basis we rely on may affect your data protection rights which are in brief set out below. You can find out more about your data protection rights and the exemptions which may apply on the ICO's website:

- Your right of access You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information. You can request other information such as details about where we get personal information from and who we share personal information with. There are some exemptions which means you may not receive all the information you ask for. You can read more about this right here.
- Your right to rectification You have the right to ask us to correct or delete personal information you think is inaccurate or incomplete. You can read more about this right here.
- **Your right to erasure** You have the right to ask us to delete your personal information. <u>You can read more about this right here</u>.
- **Your right to restriction of processing** You have the right to ask us to limit how we can use your personal information. <u>You can read more about this right here</u>.
- Your right to object to processing You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data. You can read more about this right here.
- **Your right to data portability** You have the right to ask that we transfer the personal information you gave us to another organisation, or to you. <u>You can read more about this right here</u>.
- Your right to withdraw consent When we use consent as our lawful basis you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. You can read more about this right here.

Our lawful bases for the collection and use of your data

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information to **provide and improve products and services for clients**, for **information updates or marketing purposes**, for **research or archiving purposes**, to **comply with legal requirements** and for **dealing with queries**, **complaints or claims** is:

• Consent - we have permission from you after we gave you all the relevant information. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to object. To be clear, you do have the right to withdraw your consent at any time.

Leeds Lymphoma Course will retain your personal data only for as long as is necessary for the purposes set out in this privacy policy. We will retain and use your personal data to the extent necessary to comply with our legal obligations (for example, if we are required to retain your data to comply with applicable laws), resolve disputes, and enforce our legal agreements and policies.

The company will also retain usage data for internal analysis purposes. Usage data is generally retained for a shorter period of time, except when this data is used to strengthen the security or to improve the functionality of our service, or we are legally obligated to retain this data for longer time periods.
